



Years 12 & 13 A Level Art students visited three Málaga galleries this month. They began with CAC, which hosts a range of international contemporary work, and then walked through the graffiti-adorned streets of Málaga, arriving at Arsenal, an open-air gallery which displays art by young and up-and-coming international artists. Students then deepened their appreciation of Russian Constructivism mixed with cutting-edge sculpture and video installation at the Centro Pompidou. Students thoroughly enjoyed
